

A pan-Canadian Approach to Inflammatory Arthritis Models of Care


PURPOSE:

What is the approach to models of care?

A team effort requiring effective collaboration between health care professionals knowledgeable in arthritis assessment and treatment. Our approach to MOC lays out the relationships and steps amongst providers to deliver an optimal IA patient journey from detection to diagnosis, treatment, rehabilitation and remission.

- Patient-Centred, inter-professional, team-based approach
- Streamlining early detection and diagnosis
- Escalating treatment to facilitate and maintain remission

The benefits of this approach are much better outcomes for the patient, as well as significant impacts downstream for the health system and the economy as a whole.



Standardized IA Care Path & Toolkit

- ☐ Care Pathway to illustrate the flow of patients through the continuum of care to ensure the patient has access to the right care provider at the right time in the care pathway.
- ☐ Tools to assist in moving patient through the care pathway.

Inflammatory Arthritis Care Map


