Measurement Framework for Inflammatory Arthritis Models of Care

The Alliance Models of Care (MOC) Measurement working group are working together to define system level performance measures to evaluate health systems and inform system changes with the goal of developing safe, cost-effective, efficient, high quality care for patients with IA. The working group recently met to discuss the process for developing a core starter set of performance measurement themes. This will be followed by a literature review to ensure validity of proposed measures. An online state-of-the art consensus meeting will be held to finalize the measures. The measures will then be presented for broad stakeholder input at the AAC meeting in November 2014. Pilot testing of the measures in champion provinces will follow. These issues include:

- 1. Access to Aristospan® TH
- 2. Liquid non-steroidal anti-inflammatory medication discontinued
- 3. Making it easier for patients with arthritis to take methotrexate, and
- 4. Access to Biologics.

Arthritis Consumer Experts (ACE) attended 2014 CADTH Symposium and presented at a Concurrent Session on April 8th, titled Health Technology Assessment of Biosimilars (SEBs): A Canadian Perspective moderated by Angela Rocchi, Principal at Axia Research. Cheryl Koehn presented alongside Dr. Jian Wang (Division Chief, Clinical Evaluation Division, Biologics and Genetic Therapies Directorate), Health Canada, Dr. Chander Sehgal (Director, Common Drug Review and Optimal Use of Drugs), CADTH, Steve Long (former Executive Director, Pharmaceutical Funding and Guidance Branch), Alberta Ministry of Health. ACE's presentation was focused on why stakeholders should care about SEB regulation in Canada, provided a review of consumer/patient input to date on SEBs and the need for a patient-centred approach to SEB review and regulation.

Based on the feedback and priorities suggested by last fall's successful awareness and engagement campaign, Share The Pain, The Arthritis Society launched Erase The Pain (www.thepain.ca) this month – a \$25 million campaign to erase the pain of arthritis in three ways. "Cure" will fund novel research into genes, nerve pathways and the mechanisms of arthritis. "Care" will increase the number of practicing rheumatologists across Canada, and provide arthritis-specific training for



practicing rheumatologists across Canada, and provide arthritis-specific training for other health care professionals. "Community" will develop an online information service and home for the Canadian arthritis community.

The Passing of Harold Robinson

Dr. Harold Speers Robinson passed away on April 3rd at age 95. We would like to recognize the incredible contributions and impact he had on rheumatology not only in British Columbia, but across the country and continent. Often referred to as the father of arthritis care in BC by his colleagues, Dr. Robinson was the first Medical Director of The Arthritis Society and worked alongside Mary Pack. He was an international pioneer in providing multidisciplinary care for arthritis patients and was an amazing mentor to many. Always held in special esteem, his innovative work and involvement with The Arthritis Society were renowned, and had him widely recognized as a world leader in RA patient care. Dr. Harold Robinson has left a legacy that will continue to benefit those living with arthritis.

Presenter Dr. Catherine Backman will draw on a study of 350 mothers with and without inflammatory arthritis. The webinar describes how parenting tasks and sense of efficacy as a mother are experienced in the presence of a chronic illness. Parenting is an important life role. Chronic illness or health conditions have an impact on how adults participate in parenting tasks and experience role engagement, and tips from mothers who have 'figured things out' are useful to occupational therapists working with clients facing new challenges as a result of simultaneously managing their health condition and their occupation as mother.

First-of-Its-Kind Multinational Survey Confirms Psoriasis and Psoriatic Arthritis Patients are Frequently Undertreated or Not Treated at All

On March 20, 2014, Celgene Inc. issued a media release, featuring a unique and extensive survey (called MAPP) that provides the first-of-its-kind multinational look into the impact psoriasis and psoriatic arthritis (PsA) have on patients' lives, revealing several areas which warrant further attention and action, including high rates of undertreatment, a mismatch between patient/physician assessment of the disease, and the desire for new treatment options.

The survey explored the impact of psoriasis and PsA on disease-related quality of life (QoL), physician-patient relationship, unmet treatment need and patients' satisfaction with current medical care and therapies. Findings from the survey, which was sponsored by Celgene, were published in the online edition of the Journal of the American Academy of Dermatology http://www.jaad.org/article/S0190-9622(14)00977-3/abstract.

The goal is for these health professionals to become the local arthritis clinical resource in their community. Over the decades, the ACE program has evolved to include several key components:

- Annual 4-day course, "Introduction to the Assessment and Management of Rheumatic Diseases: A Skills Workshop for Nurses, Physical Therapists and Occupational Therapists"
- Additional online and onsite continuing education opportunities
- Online resources such as assessment tools, treatment approaches, clinical practice guidelines, and patient education materials
- Discipline-specific case consultation
- Clinically-focused teleconference-based journal club
- Electronic newsletter of clinical information and upcoming events
- Directory of ACE-trained health professionals

The existence of a network of trained clinicians promotes province-wide best practices in arthritis care and helps to ensure that this care is received closer to home. Have your voice heard to create "patient centred" health care

The Canadian Medical Association (CMA), the Canadian Nurses Association (CNA) and the Health Action Lobby (HEAL) have convened a Health Providers Steering Committee to review the way health care is delivered in Canada. Among the criticisms of our health care system is that health care is designed from the provider's point of view and that nationally, delivery of care lacks coordination and integration between federal government, provinces, territories, and municipalities.

During the two summits, the CMA, the CNA, and HEAL, together with patients, developed five foundations for integrated and effective health care for patients, including **patient access**, **patient-centred care**, **informational continuity**, **management continuity**, **relational continuity**. The CMA is reaching out to health care providers and patients to validate that the founding principles above are a true representation of patient expectations for effective health care.
