

Update on the Measurement Framework for Inflammatory Arthritis (IA) Models of Care



The Arthritis Alliance of Canada is developing a performance measurement framework to evaluate Inflammatory Arthritis Models of Care. The measures are a critical starting point for a discussion of quality and access to arthritis care in Canada aiming to assist health care decision makers to identify and prioritize areas for improvement, benchmarking, strategy planning, system changes and measuring outcomes.

We are pleased to announce that a manuscript on "Development of System-Level Performance Measures for Evaluation of Models of Care for Inflammatory Arthritis" has been finalized; the project lead Dr. Claire Barber, University of Calgary recently submitted the work to the Arthritis Care & Research Journal, American College of Rheumatology.

The Walk 10 Blocks team successfully deployed its survey and finalized the results. There were a total of 344 participants and the findings were discussed at a planning meeting and will be submitted for publication in 2015. The survey confirms that 89% respondents preferred walking as their main source of exercise. ACE led a brainstorming meeting that brought all Walk 10 Blocks stakeholders together. The CAnadian Network for Advanced Interdisciplinary Methods for comparative effectiveness research' (CAN-AIM) team was funded by CIHR to develop novel methods using prospective longitudinal cohorts and to respond to key knowledge gaps regarding drug safety and effectiveness by answering queries



which arise from Health Canada and other regulatory parties. Our demonstration project looked at the comparative effectiveness of anti-tumour necrosis factor (TNF) agents versus traditional disease-modifying agents (DMARDs) in reducing orthopaedic surgery in rheumatoid arthritis (RA). INSTITUTE OF HEALTH ECONOMICS "Rheumatoid arthritis in a policy perspective"

A "Registry for research and better treatment of Albertans" was published by the Institute of Health Economics in March 2015. This report was done in collaboration with the Institute of Health Economics, the University of Calgary, the University of Alberta and the McCaig Institute for Bone and Joint Health. The objectives of this report were to highlight the benefits of the current Rheumatoid Arthritis (RA) Biologics registry in Alberta (Alberta Pharmacosurveillance Program) and the importance of an expanded RA registry moving forward. Overall, 11 recommendations were made spanning the areas of funding support, operational changes, evidence generation and partnerships. With subsequent entry biologics now here, there is growing impetus for a registry that expands on the previous biologics registry, which only included patients who were prescribed a biologic therapy.

McCaig INSTITUTE FOR BONE AND JOINT HEALTH (MIBJH) UNIVERSITY OF CALGARY

McCaig Institute for Bone and Joint Health The 2nd Annual McCaig Meeting in Musculoskeletal (MSK) Diseases took place on May 8, 2015 at the University of Calgary. The event is organized annually to bring together the multidisciplinary labs and clinicians in the MIBJH to present their research developments. The keynote speakers were internationally

renowned researchers Susmita Bose, PhD from Washington State University and Kathryn Sophia Stok, PhD from Eidgenossische Technische Hochschule in Zurich. About 100 trainees and faculty members attended this year's event which involved 21 talks from trainees and 30 poster presentations; a great opportunity for trainees to practice their presentation skills!

WESTERN UNIVERSITY Western establishes The Bone and Joint Institute

Western University has taken another bold step toward positioning itself as a global leader in research and innovation in musculoskeletal (MSK) health by establishing The Bone and Joint Institute. The Institute will focus on four academic priorities: excellence in innovation, including new preventive, rehabilitative, medical and surgical therapies, diagnostic techniques, and medical

and assistive devices; collaboration, bringing together integrated transdisciplinary teams; education, to produce the next generation of MSK researchers; and knowledge translation, to move new knowledge from the laboratory to the community, marketplace and clinic.

The Bone and Joint Institute and the Collaborative Training Program in Muskuloskeletal Health Research (CMHR) also announced that Dr. Shabana Amanda Ali has been named the first recipient of the Kirkley Postdoctoral Fellowship in Musculoskeletal Health Research and Innovation, which is aimed at promoting the recruitment of exceptional candidates to foster new collaborative research and bridge existing areas of strength in MSK research at Western. These announcements build on Western's \$5 million investment in the Western Cluster of Research Excellence in Musculoskeletal Health in November 2014, funding more than 70 researchers from the Schulich School of Medicine & Dentistry and the Faculties of Health Sciences, Engineering, Science and Social Science to study conditions such as arthritis, osteoporosis, trauma, and work, sport and exercise-related injuries.
