The Canadian Rheumatology Association Journal (CRAJ) featured the Arthritis Alliance of Canada (AAC)'s special issue in their recent Spring 2018 publication. We are pleased that the CRAJ chose to focus on the efforts of the Arthritis Alliance of Canada (AAC) to build a framework for innovative and implementable Models of Care (MOC), recognizing endless hours of work by researchers, health care professionals, consumer groups and other AAC partners, in their March edition. With six million Canadians living with arthritis and related musculoskeletal conditions projected to double in less than 20 years, the need for new approaches that offer practical and results-oriented tools has never been greater.

The AAC was ahead of the wave in recognizing this need, beginning work more than ten years ago to develop a strategic, scalable and sustainable MOC framework that can be customized and used across healthcare systems in Canada. 

UNIVERSITY OF CALGARY

Call for Participation in Pilot Testing of a Tool!

A team of researchers at University of Calgary is seeking **adult patients** (age>40) with **knee osteoarthritis** (**KOA**) that have experienced knee pain on most days of the month at any time in the past, to participate in the **pilot testing** phase of our CIHR-funded research project based at the University of Calgary (Principal Investigators: Deborah Marshall (researcher), Jolanda Cibere (physician), Syliva Teare (patient)).

The tool - Knee Osteoarthritis Self-management and Knowledge Application (KOASK App) - was co-developed with KOA patients, family physicians and researchers. The evaluation will involve testing the App over a 6-week period and providing feedback in an interview (in person or by video conference), and by completing a questionnaire at the start and the end of the evaluation period. During the evaluation period, patients will be provided with the App prototype that they will be encouraged to use daily.

The App includes features such **symptom tracking, goal setting, and activity planning,** and also provides links to **evidence-based information** about KOA management. In total, this is expected to take **2-3 hours** to complete all questionnaires and interviews **plus time using the App**. 

The CAnadian Network for Advanced Interdisciplinary Methods for comparative effectiveness research (CAN-AIM) objective is to respond to key knowledge gaps regarding drug safety and effectiveness by answering queries which arise from Health Canada and other regulatory parties. We are currently working with several enhanced cohorts, including PiMS, CATCH, CanHepC and



GENESIS-PRAXY, as well as responding to a number of queries from Health Canada. Our team has collaborated with DSECT's webinar series; we encourage you to participate in the very informative sessions. McGill University Health Centre







Interesting research projects are underway at the Research Institute of the McGill University Health Centre (RI MUHC), led by rheumatologist Dr.Evelyne Vinet. To improve strategies for health professionals counselling pregnant women with rheumatic disease, her team is conducting a focus group study assessing the clinical and psychosocial needs, barriers, and facilitators to pregnancy counselling in women with RA and SLE. She is also building the Lupus prEGnAnCY (LEGACY)

cohort, a large, multi-centre, international prospective cohort of SLE pregnancies, to evaluate adverse pregnancy outcomes, their predictors, and potential preventive therapies. A Canadian Initiative for Outcomes Research in Arthritis (CIORA) funded randomized controlled trial is underway assessing an educational tool for improving preeclampsia knowledge in pregnant women with SLE. Of note, team members of the Montreal General Hospital Lupus Clinic took part in the Scotia Bank Charity Challenge 5K run on April 21. The event raised funds to support the Singer Family Fund for Lupus Research, funding that is instrumental to funding research activities at the clinic. Team members of the RI MUHC, including McGill University trainees, found success at the 2018 CRA Annual Scientific Meeting & AHPA Annual Meeting. Dr. Evelyne Vinet won the 2018 CRA Young Investigator award, an award distributed annually to a young Canadian Investigator who has contributed significant, original research in rheumatology as judged by

peers and citations. Dr. Vinet was awarded this distinction due to the many studies she has completed on reproductive issues in rheumatic diseases. McGill trainees won four out of the ten possible abstract awards handed out by the CRA to honour their research: Dr. Arielle Mendel received the <u>Best Abstract on Quality Care Initiatives in Rheumatology</u> award; Dr. Sophie Wojcik was awarded the <u>Best Abstract on Clinical or Epidemiology Research by a Trainee - Phil Rosen Award</u> and also won <u>Best Presenter</u> during her presentation of a difficult case during the *Clinical Pearls and Mysterious Cases* session. Dr. Marie Hudson's trainee Dr. Jessica Salituri won the <u>Best Abstract on Basic Science Research by a Trainee</u> and Dr. Hudson's medical student Teddi Qendro was also the recipient of the <u>Best Abstract by a Medical Student</u>. Dr. Marie Hudson held a workshop on myositis to address challenges the clinician faces in the diagnosis and prognosis of myositis and to teach participants how to use the 2017 EULAR/ACR classification criteria and recognize the different ways in which myositis presents. Dr. Hudson also held a presentation introducing the

Canadian Scleroderma Stem Cell Transplant Research Group (CanSSCeT-RG), a Canadian scleroderma stem cell transplant research network with the aim of ensuring that Canadians have access to this therapy. Dr. Mary-Ann Fitzcharles held a workshop presenting data from a 2017 CRA survey of rheumatologist's perceptions of medical marijuana and provided updated information to help guide discussions between physicians and patients about the use and associated risks of using medical marijuana.
