On June 7 and 8 at the KT Canada scientific meeting, Arthritis Broadcast Network hosted its inaugural online #Greek2Street event. Consumer-patient "reporters" interviewed conference presenters and attendees over live Facebook and twitter broadcasts. The aim of the event was to de-mystify the world of knowledge translation, and to bring current KT research to the broad online patient community, in an engaging and accessible way. New Workbook For Collaboration and Research

Arthritis Research Canada (ARC) is excited to announce that a new workbook is now available to help research teams of academics and patients plan how they will work together on a project. Patient engagement, including family members and caregivers, is becoming central to how health research is conducted in Canada. This engagement is essential to shaping research that reflects patients' priorities.



ARC studied the experiences and views of ARC's Arthritis Patient Advisory Board members and determined the key elements to a meaningful working relationship with researchers. The findings showed a lack of practical resources available to help guide their partnership. Without proper direction, these partnerships may leave patients feeling that their involvement is tokenism and not reflective of their rich experiential perspectives.

This framework is the foundation for a workbook to help research teams plan patient engagement activities. The workbook takes research teams through the eight components of the framework. Within each component, key questions are provided to guide the team discussion to generate dialogue on how each component will be addressed in the partnership. Towards the end of the workbook, team members are directed to select the key components that will form their work plan.

This workbook was created within a research project lead by Clayon Hamilton and co-researchers to develop metric to evaluate the quality of patient engagement in research. For more information click on the PEIR Plan Workbook.

GLA:DTM Program Report on Implementation and Outcomes

GLA:D™ Canada is pleased to announce the release of the 2017 Annual Report on the Implementation and Outcomes of the GLA:D® Program in Canada. The report summarizes the highlights from inception to December 2017 of the community-based education and exercise program for people with hip and knee osteoarthritis. Highlights include:



Training and Implementation:

- 14 courses for Health Care Providers (HCPs)
- 61 sites implemented the program by December 2017 in 5 provinces

Patient outcomes:

- 28% reduction in pain intensity
- 35% of participants increased their physical activity



These results show that the GLA:D® program is successfully helping individuals with hip and knee OA manage their symptoms, improve their function and quality of life, and increase their physical activity. CANADIAN RHEUMATOLOGY ADMINISTRATIVE DATA NETWORK



The CANRAD Network team includes a variety of decision makers, epidemiologists, clinicians and researchers interested in the use of administrative data for rheumatic disease research. We held a CANRAD Network Meeting during the 2018 CRA Annual Scientific Meeting & AHPA Annual Meeting in Vancouver, BC and we will be organizing a CANRAD Network Webinar this summer! The CAnadian Network for Advanced Interdisciplinary Methods for comparative effectiveness research (CAN-AIM) objective is to respond to key knowledge gaps regarding drug safety and effectiveness by answering queries which arise from Health Canada and other regulatory parties. We are currently working with several enhanced cohorts, including PiMS, CATCH, CanHepC and GENESIS-PRAXY, as well as responding to a number of queries from Health Canada. Our

MUHC - Lupus & Vasculitis clinic

Interesting research projects are underway at the Research Institute of the McGill University Health Centre (RI MUHC), led by rheumatologist Dr. Evelyne Vinet. To improve strategies for health professionals counselling for pregnant women with rheumatic disease, her team is conducting a focus group study assessing the clinical and psychosocial needs, barriers, and facilitators to pregnancy councelling in women with

RA and SLE. She is also building the Lupus prEGnAnCY (LEGACY) cohort, a large, multi-centre, international prospective cohort of SLE pregnancies, to evaluate adverse pregnancy outcomes, their predictors, and potential preventive therapies. A Canadian Initiative for Outcomes Research in Arthritis (CIORA) funded randomized controlled trial is underway assessing an educational tool for improving preeclampsia knowledge in pregnant women with SLE. Of note, team members of the Montreal General Hospital Lupus Clinic took part in the Scotia Bank Charity Challenge 5K run on April 21. The event raised funds to support the Singer Family Fund for Lupus Research, funding that is instrumental to funding research activities at the clinic.
